THE PARNELL LECTURE SERIES

The Parnell Lecture is given annually by the Visiting Parnell Fellow. The Parnell Fellowship, which was established in the early 1990s by generous benefactions, is named for Charles Stuart Parnell who was an undergraduate of the College between 1865 and 1869. Parnell became leader of the Irish Parliamentary Party (1880-1890) and a major figure in the Irish independence movement. The Fellowship brings to Magdalene each year a distinguished scholar in any discipline within the broad range of Irish Studies. The chief organizer of the Parnell Fellowship and therefore of the *Parnell Lecture Series* is Professor Eamon Duffy.
